Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

When promulgating the Constitution Lumen Gentium on November 21, 1964, Blessed Pope Paul VI stressed the importance of Chapter 8, which concerns the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Mystery of Christ and the Church.

Blessed Paul VI used to present it as the "summit and crowning" of all the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church. At the same time, he put his personal seal on it by solemnly declaring Mary Mother of the Church.

His successors in the chair of St. Peter have magnificently unfolded this great doctrine of Vatican II, especially Saint Pope John Paul II, recently canonized by our Pope Francis.

Saint John Paul II, who participated in the Council and then was given the mission of guiding the Church over the threshold of the third millennium, developed this Marian doctrine of the Council, in line with the writings of a saint of the past that had a profound impact on him all his life: the Treatise on True devotion to the Blessed Virgin by St. Louis de Montfort (1673-1716).
