ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Tuesday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. **It is a Holy Day of Obligation.** The Church commemorates that Mary, who bore the Incarnate and Risen Word in her womb, did not experience death and decay. Rather she is the first to share in her Son's risen life and is assumed into heaven. As the East refers to this feast, the Virgin Mary fell asleep into eternity. ST. ROSE OF LIMA ANOINTING MASS

As we honor St. Rose of Lima our Patroness, we will celebrate a Mass with the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick on Monday, August 21 at 7:00 p.m. Anyone in need of the sacrament and those wishing to pray for those in need of healing are invited.

Deacon Jim’s “A Moment with Our Lady”

In the 13th century there used to be a Gothic church in the village center of Laeken, north of Brussels, Belgium. An interesting story is told about its construction. It is said that every morning, workers who had begun to build the foundations, found their work of the previous day destroyed. On the fourth day, they hid to catch those responsible. They found themselves face to face with the Virgin Mary, Saint Barbara and Saint Catherine. The Virgin left behind a thread indicating the orientation and dimensions to give the church.

In 1633 this thread, which was the object of veneration and to which miraculous powers were attributed, was stolen. The person guilty of this desecration was burned at the stake on the Grand-Place in Brussels. Besides this thread, a statue of Our Lady was also venerated at this shrine, to which tradition and many legends also attribute miraculous powers.

Starting in 1781, the governors of the region built Schoonenberg Castle near Notre Dame Church of Laeken, which is still the official residence of the Belgian royal family, known as the Castle of Laeken.

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

Follow the Consent (marriage vows) of the couple, the revised Order of Celebrating Matrimony directs the Reception of the Consent. The priest or deacon addresses the bride and bridegroom asking God to strengthen the Consent made before the Church. An acclamation on the part of the assembly follows. The acclamation may be sung. This acclamation could be the alleluias of the Gospel acclamation; the refrain of the responsorial psalm, the refrain to the Glory to God, or any appropriate acclamation of praise. The cantor would lead those gathered for the wedding in this refrain of praise to God. This addition to the revised rite gives those present for the Sacrament of Matrimony to publicly give thanks to God for the marriage of this couple.
