Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

The first meeting of the Legion of Mary was held on September 7, 1921, the eve of the feast of Our Lady's Nativity. On that day, in Dublin, Ireland, fifteen young women, one priest and one layman-Frank Duff, a young official of the Ministry of Finance—knelt on the floor around an improvised altar. They sought an apostolate with and for Mary, in accordance with the teachings of Saint Louis de Montfort. Filled with enthusiasm, the group invoked the Holy Spirit, and then recited the Rosary. Together they proposed to make regular visits to the sick and those in distress. They unanimously chose to hold weekly meetings with prayer, spiritual talks and reports from each member on the previous week's work. Thus, the Legion of Mary was born and Mary's spiritual army was soon to encircle the globe.

If a tree is judged by its fruits, and the blood of martyrs is the seed of Christians, then the Legion of Mary has every reason to hope for a glorious future in the battlefield of Mary's, and the Church's warfare against the forces of evil. The worldwide apostolate has been called "a miracle of these modern times," and from its inception, the Legion of Mary has always supported the papacy.

REDEMPTORIST PARISH MISSION

St. Michael the Archangel Parish in Hollidaysburg will be hosting a Redemptorist Mission from Monday to Wednesday, September 11th to 13th.

The theme of the Mission Talks after a 9 o'clock morning Mass will be the challenge, cost, and reward of discipleship. The Mission Talks during a 7 o'clock evening service will focus on encountering Jesus in the sacraments. During the evening services, the Sacrament of the Sick will be celebrated on Monday, the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Tuesday, and the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Mass) on Wednesday.

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

The order of Celebrating Matrimony offers three distinct rituals for celebrating the Sacrament of Matrimony. First, there is the order of celebrating Matrimony with Mass; second, there is the order of celebrating Matrimony without Mass; and the Church presents a third ritual for celebrating Matrimony between a Catholic and a Catechumen or a Non-Christian. All three orders contain: scripture and homily, questions of intent addressed to the bride and groom, consent between the man and woman, blessing and giving of rings, universal prayer, Our Father and Nuptial Blessing. It is the usual custom to have two Catholics married within Mass.
