Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

When Pius XII made the consecration, there was a hidden mention of Russia that was understood by God. What was missing at the time was the union with all the bishops of the world. Since that consecration was a call to union with all the People of God, this aspect was essential.

Later, the popes who came after Pius XII have more or less repeated the same consecration, in which the union with all the bishops of the world was still missing. For this reason, in 1982, I told the Apostolic Nuncio, Msgr Portalupi that this consecration did not comply with the requests of Our Lady...

Subsequently, after bringing the image of Our Lady of Fatima to Rome, Saint Pope John Paul II undertook to complete the consecration on March 25, 1984 (actually on the 24th, the vigil of the feast of the Annunciation), writing to all the bishops to ask them to make the consecration in their own diocese...He made the consecration publicly, in union with all the bishops who, in turn and with His Holiness, made it in union with the People of God, Christ's mystical body.

MISSION CO-OP COLLECTION-JULY 7-8

Founded by Saint Anthony Mary Claret in Spain in the year 1859; The Claretian Missionaries from Canada and the USA arrived in Cameroon in 1970 and 1986, respectively. They worked very hard in the religious, social and humanitarian spheres. Today, thanks to their hard work, the Claretians (50 priests and almost 100 seminarians) are serving in nine dioceses, and in 18 parishes in Cameroon. Their apostolate is based on working with the poorest of the poor, and the marginalized on the peripheries. Pope Francis has encouraged all Christians to go to the peripheries and help those living there. They are privileged to be missionaries in these peripheries.

There have been many conflicts in Cameroon, with nefarious consequences. In the North, the Boko Haram crises, has led to many deaths and refugees. Many die of malnutrition. Many of their parishes are located in areas where there is conflict known as the Anglophone Crisis. Many families whose houses and properties have been burnt come to live in the Church building as their only source of hope. Some have moved to the forest, living under a hot sun and heavy downpour of rains. Our missionaries have moved with them to these areas. They serve not only as priests, but as nurses, midwives, teachers, etc. It has been extremely hard to feed our Christians as the local food supply is running out.

They are appealing for you support to save a life from premature death. They intend to sink bore holes to give them potable water, and wish to engage them in basic subsistence agriculture to work for their own food. They also want to put up dispensaries to cater for the medical welfare of these people. If they do not respond quickly, there may be outbreak of health epidemics and some of the angry and hungry youths may start taking arms as it is the case in some areas.

Next weekend, July 7 & 8 an appeal will be made asking for your donations.

The Church has made clear statements on the practice of burying the remains of our dead. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2016 stated doctrinal and pastoral reasons for the preference of the burial of the remains of the faithful and to set out norms pertaining to the conservation of ashes in the case of cremation.

The Church encourages conventional burial of the faithful whenever possible, i.e., burial in a grave or mausoleum, as well as requires the appropriate reservation of the remains when cremation occurs.
