Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

It seems that the devotion to Mary began in Marseilles (France) even before her Assumption. At any rate, it quickly supplanted the cults of Diana, Apollo, Minerva, and Jupiter, as shrines dedicated to the Virgin quickly replaced the important pagan monuments atop Marseilles' seven hills.

Today, the number and importance of the places dedicated to the "Good Mother," "Our Lady" or the "Madonna" is significant in Provence. Fifteen are especially prominent, among them the Basilica of Our Lady of the Guard in Marseilles, and the Shrine of Our Lady of Cotignac.

The fourth century has been called the "brilliant century of Christianity in Provence," since it produced the two flagship abbeys of Saint Victor in Marseilles and Lérins Island near Cannes. With the Primacy in Arles and its influence on the Gallic churches, monasticism arrived in Gaul through Provence with Saint John Cassian in particular.

Thus Provence was the first region of France to welcome Christianity. By appearing at Cotignac, the Virgin Mary chose the perfect place and time to distribute her graces.

THE GIFT OF TIME

I learned the phrase *tempus fugit* in high school Latin class but never really understood its meaning until I reached middle age. Now I know how quickly "time Flies." Toddlers became teenagers and before you know it, you are celebrating a grandson's First Communion

Over the years I've learned that time is a precious commodity, not anything to be squandered on "to do" lists. At its best it is a gift meant to be generously shared with those we love. So now to my best advice for parents:

Find time to play together as a family. I remember the busyness of family life. It takes so much time to cook and clean, shop and do laundry, take care of the yard, get homework done, attend Little League, Scouts, parent meetings, etc. There are only 24 hours in a day, and eight to 10 of them are spent at work or school. And then there's sleep. It is so easy to let the days slip by with no time to play. But scientists tell us that play is an essential part of healthy life, even for adults.

Playing together as a family teaches us how to interact and develop relationships of trust and mutuality. We can learn to communicate in comfortable, informal settings. Play can even help us let go of aggressive tendencies. And it is a great way to relieve stress.

This summer try reclaiming Sunday as family day. After church, spend a few hours playing together. Fly a kite, toss a Frisbee or just sit home and play some board games. At first, it may seem to be the only day to get the laundry or shopping done, but this summer rethink your weekly schedule. Besides honoring the Lord there is another good reason for keeping holy the Sabbath: Your Family's well-being may depend on it.

1 to 7 children in America will lose a parent or sibling by the age of 20. Behind this statistic are real children—who are struggling with difficult emotions like loneliness, fear, and anger. At the Home Nursing Agency Healing Patch, these children find hope and healing are possible through connecting with others. New volunteers are needed to meet the growing number of families finding support at the Healing Patch.

While volunteers must understand they are unable to "fix" what has happened, they are able to facilitate activities to help children and adults connect and share their feelings in a safe and welcoming environment. Volunteers are essential for group nights, which occur two evenings a month from September through May. New volunteers receive comprehensive training and have assistance in obtaining necessary clearances.
