Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

This true story comes from Berlin. It was shared by Karl, the same German soldier who played a part in it:

When I was called up in 1943, my mother gave me a Rosary. After I was taken prisoner in Holland, I met a Scot while they were searching us. "You're Catholic," he said, surprised, as he discovered my Rosary. "Me too." And as proof, showed me his own Rosary. During the journey he told me, as I understood English: "My mother gave it to me. When I'm on duty, I recite it. What about you?" -"Yes," I said.- "So," he said, "we pray to the same Mother. That makes us brothers."

When we arrived at the camp, he actually looked after me as if I were his brother in the flesh. And the day before we were to be transferred to another camp, he took me aside and asked me to exchange Rosaries. "It will be a souvenir," he said, vigorously shaking my hand after I accepted his proposal. Since then, I have always carried that Rosary on me.
