**Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"**

The Virgin Mary gave us the means to defeat atheistic Communism. Let us remember the messages of Our Lady of Fatima. The discovery of the presence of Mary will be the one that will exceed atomic energy. Through prayer, we can have the power of God. God, however, limits his power to man's will. He needs man in order to exercise it.

The atomic bomb is the result of a fission (splitting) of the atom. The hydrogen bomb by contrast results from a merger, a meeting of two atoms, and develops a much stronger power. Thus, by a union, we get a greater force than through fission, a symbol of our power when we are united.

It is this energy that is offered by the Virgin if we resort to prayer, if we raise our "spiritual temperature." This temperature comes from Love and Charity. This temperature is never fully reached, but we can increase it each day towards God and our neighbor. The prayer that arises from a heart that loves is heard and accepted. In it lies the greatest energy, next to which the atomic bomb is nothing.
