### SAINT of the WEEK

## Saint Cyril of Alexandria

Feast Day – June 27

Cyril was born in Alexandria, Egypt, and was the nephew of its patriarch, Theophilus. Classically educated, he was ordained by his uncle, whom he succeeded as patriarch in 412. He had helped Theophilus discredit and depose St. John Chrysostom from Constantinople, in what may have been a rivalry between the two ancient sees. As patriarch, he exercised his authority hastily and violently, drawing severe criticism, and was embroiled in heretical controversies, chiefly against Nestorius of Constantinople, who taught that Mary was not the mother of God. Cyril's orthodoxy eventually was upheld by pope and emperor. This most brilliant theologian of the Alexandrian tradition was declared a doctor of the church in 1882; he is the patron of Alexandria.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 1917, dozens of people were gathered at the Cova da Iria in Fatima, near the holm oak. They were praying the Rosary, when suddenly lightning lit up the sky. Our Lady then appeared above the holm oak.

“What does Your Grace wish of me?” Lucia asked.- “I want you to come here on the 13<sup>th</sup> of next month; to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn how to read. Then I will tell you what I want.”

Lucia asked for the healing of a sick man, to which Our Lady replied: - “If he converts, he will be cured within the year.” - “I would like to ask you to take us to Heaven,” the little girl said.- “Yes I shall take Jacinta and Francisco soon, but you will remain here for some time yet. Jesus wishes to use you in order to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart in the world. I promise salvation to those who embrace it; and these souls will be beloved of God like flowers arranged by me to adorn His throne.”

“The second visit,” said Sister Lucia, “made us understand how great God is, how it is necessary to repair his violated rights, how much He loves us and wants to be loved, what is the value of sacrifice and how the Lord takes it into consideration to convert sinners.”
