Deacon Jim’s “A Moment with Our Lady”

On September 8, 1914, at 10:00 am, in the Chapel of Our Lady of the Armies, in Versailles (France), the Mother of God appeared to 23-year-old Marcelle Lanchon, who later became Sister Marie-France in religion.

“My daughter, see how I cherish your dear country. My Son wants the people to make images and statues representing me as I am appearing today, and to invoke me under the title of Queen of France. If they answer this new desire of his divine Heart, France will again become mine in a special way. I will take her forever under my maternal protection and my Son will delight in bestowing abundant blessings upon this land.”

Then the Blessed Virgin began to pray to Jesus Christ, evoking France in this way:

“My Son, forgive France, she still loves you since she has never stopped loving me.”

September 8, 1914, is also the day when the “miracle of the Marne” occurred, which prevented the invading German army from reaching Paris during World War I.

Saint Michael, Saint Gabriel and Saint Raphael

Feast Day – September 29

These archangels, messengers sent by God, are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called “the great prince”; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses’ body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel’s visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers and telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.
