### WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

Next weekend, October 17-18, we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support the young mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay teachers serve some of the poorest of the poor. ### October is the Month of the Holy Rosary!

The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the *Apostles' Creed*, which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic faith. The *Our Father*, which intro-duces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the *Hail Mary* is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary. St. Pius V officially added the second part of the *Hail Mary*. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. There are four sets of Mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and—added by Saint John Paul II in 2002—the Luminous.

**The repetition in the Rosary** is meant to lead one into restful and con-templative prayer related to each Mystery. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells. The Rosary can be said privately or with a group.

**Deacon Jim’s “A Moment with Our Lady”**

On June 13<sup>th</sup> and July 13, 1917, Our Lady of Fatima said to the little shepherds that “God wants to establish in the world devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.” The Virgin Mary did not give details about this devotion, so we can only deduce it from the different requests she made in Fatima, and in Pontevedra and Tuy (Spain).

During these apparitions, she asked for five practices: the consecration of Russia, the Communion of Reparation on the first Saturdays of the month, sacrifices offered for the conversion of sinners, the daily recitation of the Rosary and the wearing of the scapular.

Sister Lucia (one of the three visionaries of Fatima) said on October 15, 1950: “The scapular is a sign of our consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The scapular and the Rosary are inseparable.” Accordingly, the scapular and the Rosary are a part of the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. And that’s because a well recited Rosary is the prayer that most touches the heart of Our Lady.

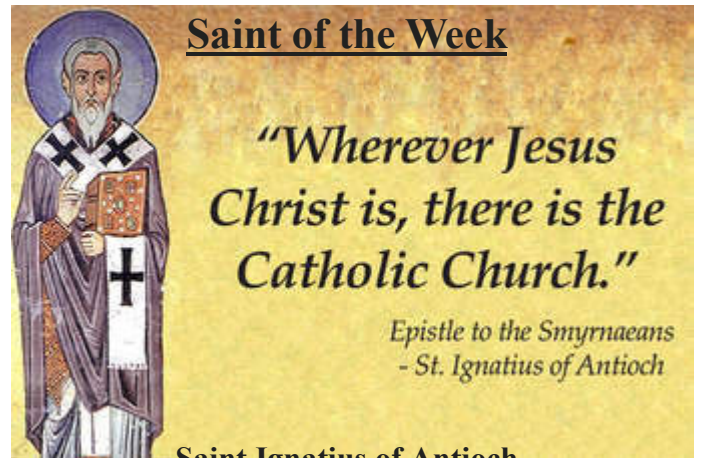

**Saint Ignatius of Antioch**

**Feast Day – October 17**

This Syrian-born martyr, who gave himself the nickname “God-bearer” because of his certainty of God’s presence within him and who may have been a disciple of St. John the Evangelist, became bishop of Antioch about 69. Eventually he was arrested and sent to Rome, where his strong desire for martyrdom was fulfilled when he was thrown to the lions in the Colosseum. In seven letters written to Christians in Asia Minor and Rome, he stressed the need to heal church conflicts, the authority of local bishops and the Eucharist as a source of unity.

**Adult Enrichment Lay Ecclesial Ministry New Course**  
**THE HISTORY OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES**

This new course covers the development of the Catholic Church in the United States from the early discoverers of North America, European Colonization, through the founding of the Spanish Missions up to the beginning of the Second Vatican Council. The purpose of the course is to trace the origins of the various traditions of Colonial Catholicism and discuss their influence on the growth of the Catholic Church. Particular attention is given to the external influences which prompted internal changes in American Catholicism such as the influence of immigrants who immigrated to the United States in the early nineteenth century, the development of dioceses in the United States and the growth of religious Orders and Catholic institutions.

The course will discuss the growth of patriotism, the impact of World War II, economic movements, government policies, and the involvement of the Catholic Church in the Industrial Revolution. The course will ending the pre-Vatican II period.
